Is the problem with the Abrahamic divide, theological comprehension of the Dharma, Dao, etc imply the Way.

To find the Way we have to recognize the ascension of the soul happens. Source of reality is like a CPU in a universal computer, that is creating or 'connect to' (Yoga), as it is creating us right now; when we learn to silence can listen.

So when Yeshua taught:

Luke 17:20-21 Being asked by the Pharisees when God's Kingdom would come "God's Kingdom doesn't come with observation; (21) neither will they say there!' for behold, God's Kingdom is within you."

This is a Dharmic principle, on inner meditation we reach Heaven within. Pharisees taught, the Bible like Hindu texts teach Hell is below us, and void (Maya)... Thus the only way to get out of here is to become enlightened.

Matthew 6:22-23 "The lamp of the body is the eye. If therefore your eye will be full of light. (23) But if your eye is evil, your whole body will be light that is in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!

So each Abrahamic religion misses parts of the Dharma:
